Utilize ReadSpeaker tools to enhance your understanding and comprehension of the posted materials. The materials in our online classroom include a Listen Button that allows you to have the text highlighted and read aloud to you. Listening to text read aloud is shown to improve your reading comprehension.

Office product files, ePubs, and PDFs can be opened in Content using the ReadSpeaker docReader.

ReadSpeaker docReader

- Click the docReader icon or link. Depending on your view, it could be in a dropdown menu to the right of the title name. The link is "Open with docReader." Or, on the right-hand side of the top of the document, you may see a speaker or a button with headphones and the text "Open docReader."
- Click the link, speaker, or button to activate the ReadSpeaker docReader.

ReadSpeaker webReader

- Click on the ReadSpeaker webReader "Listen" button, which is located at the top of Content HTML files, Assignments, Discussion Topics & Threads, and on each quiz question.
- You can change the reading speed and text highlighting colors, download the MP3 file, click on a paragraph to be read, enlarge the text, create a text mode view of the text, use a page mask, translate a word or phrase, look up a word in the dictionary, and more. Many of these tools can help readers stay focused and on track. Note: The quizzes do not include the Dictionary, Translate, and Download as mp3 tools.
- The help file has information about webReader.
- Keyboard shortcuts can be found in Settings and customized to your preferences.
